The most common cause of an alarm keypad that doesn't work is a blown fuse or tripped circuit breaker. When you use your remote to arm or disarm your security system as it sends a signal to your alarm system; if there's no power getting to your alarm panel, it won't work.

On working system. Switch off power or remove fuse. When battery have enough power. Alarm panel should work from battery. Remove baterry and check Volts using multimeter. If you have not experience, you should call alarm engineer. Alarm system should be tested minimum once a year. Average battery life is 3 years. No lights = No Power usually.

The internal battery inside the Ring Alarm Base Station has a limited capacity. To conserve power, when the internal battery is in use, Alarm Pro will shut down most Alarm functionality and turn wifi off, even if you have a working internet connection. You will only be able to arm and disarm. Ring Alarm will be triggered by an alarming event.

Go to your main control box and disconnect the battery supply, which will stop all beeping and shut your alarm system down. Once power is restored, you can reconnect your battery and your alarm system should work as before.
