State retailers are required to accept a used automotive battery with purchase of a new one. Do not place on curb or in carts for pick-up. Lithium single-use and button-cell batteries. Single-use, long-lasting lithium batteries will be labeled &quot;Lithium&quot; or &quot;Li&quot;. They should not be confused with rechargeable &quot;Lithium-Ion (Li-Ion)&quot; batteries.

Due to the advanced technology behind lithium batteries which makes them significantly smaller and lighter they can be used in many applications. What are Lithium-Ion Batteries Used In? Lithium-ion batteries are used in many common household applications and there is a good chance that you have one in your home without even knowing it.

Simply follow the instructions at the Recycling Center (usually found near the front of a Lowe's store) for proper rechargeable battery recycling. Alkaline batteries, those most often found in children's toys, electronics, and flashlights are unrecyclable; since they are no longer made of hard metals your best option is to simply put them ...

Rechargeable batteries can be properly recycled at major retailers (e.g., Lowe's, Best Buy, The Home Depot) that participate in the Call2Recycle program. The program is free to residents and accepts Lithium Ion (Li-ion), Nickel Cadmium (Ni-Cd), Nickel-Metal Hydride (Ni-MH), and Nickel Zinc (Ni-ZN) as well as small lead-acid batteries.

Businesses including Home Depot, Lowe's, and Staples have electronics recycling programs that accept batteries and other e-waste at stores across the country as well. Some Best Buy locations take batteries, too. Earth911 and Call2Recycle have tools to help locate recycling drop-off points, allowing you to search for collections by battery type.
