

## How to fix sony home theater system push power protector

I have recently bought a Sony DAV IS10 and have only been using it for half a day and I got the same error message "Push Power Protector". The manual asks you to check for ...

Sony Support DVD Home Theater Systems. ... refer to the instruction manual with the product. If the words PROTECTOR and PUSH POWER appear in alternating sequence on the display. ... The connected home theater system, audio receiver, or soundbar isn't set to properly decode the digital signal. Your TV isn't set to a digital channel, or playing a.

When power returns at a higher voltage than the power rating of the receiver system, it is more likely to enter the protector mode. Short circuit: Short circuits occur when two different electrical cables or components form an abnormal connection, even though these components or cables are meant to have different voltages.

This is normal. To reset the internal surge protection circuit unplug the AC power cord from the wall for at least 30 minutes. Ensure the top of the home audio device has proper ventilation to keep it from overheating. Running the home audio device in a poorly ventilated cabinet can trigger the protection circuit. Reduce the volume level.

corrective steps suggested but nothing works

The common problem of "Protector Push Power" started on my Sony Home Theater DAV TZ210 a couple of days ago. The online suggestions of checking the speaker wires didn't fix the issue. Finally I cleaned the internal boards and reattached all the internal cables which seems to have partially fix the problem.

I haven"t used the home theatre in a few weeks, and I woke up this morning to find the receiver stating "PUSH POWER" and "PROTECTOR". I took the advice of a store associate and unplugged the speakers and power, let it sit for an hour or so - and then plugged the unit in, only(no speakers connected) to find the display still flashing.

There is one step you can take here, both as a possible fix, as well as a diagnostic evaluation: 1) Unplug the power cord from the outlet. 2) Wait at least 1 hour (60+ Minutes) 3) Press and hold the power button (on the set, not the remote) for 60 seconds 4) Keep holding power button while plugging back in, and for another 60 seconds after.
