A " spike" to 17% shouldn"t be a very large increase in power draw. Sometimes the GPU can spike very high and exceed what a PSU can provide. Introduction. High CPU usage by the "System" process can often be caused by a hardware driver issue (bug, old version, incompatility etc). The System process loads (or hosts) multiple hardware drivers from different vendors that require higher level of memory access.
